ES Stamp gives a digital object a visible route to its supporting EviState record—so a recipient can inspect the evidence, not merely trust the appearance of a mark.

THE PROPOSITION

A visible inspection route from a represented file or object to a persistent evidence record.

WHY IT MATTERS

Digital objects travel without their context.

They include purchase orders, invoices, contracts, presentations, sales materials, photographs, videos, bills and statements. Each can be copied, changed or detached from its source.

WHAT ES STAMP DOES

It provides a route to inspection.

The live record can identify the represented object, the accountable party, the recording context and the lifecycle information made available for review.

HOW IT WORKS

01

Record the object

Capture the represented state and its context.



02

Apply the route

Place an ES Stamp linked to the record.



03

Inspect evidence

Open the live record and review its status.

WHAT A RECIPIENT CAN INSPECT

Recorded state

The supplied representation and its recorded identity.

Accountability

The party associated with the record or claim.

Time & context

When and in what context the object was recorded.

Provenance

Evidence made available about origin and handling.

Lifecycle

Correction, withdrawal or supersession information.

Object match

Whether the supplied object matches the recorded state.

IMPORTANT BOUNDARY

The visible stamp is not the evidence.

ES Stamp does not by itself prove truth, originality, copyright or legal ownership. It gives the recipient a route to the evidence that has been recorded.
